



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### A Message from the Organizers

The second edition of the Libya Energy & Economic Summit (LEES) was one of the most influential events in the nation's history. True to its mission, the summit provided a dynamic platform to showcase Libya's top energy prospects, forge strategic partnerships and drive foreign investment. Across two days of programming, LEES 2024 produced a series of industry milestones, witnessing new investment commitments from the private sector and signifying a resounding vote of confidence in Libya's business ecosystem.

In a historic opening address, Prime Minister of Libya, H.E. Abdulhamid Al-Dbeibeh, invited foreign energy companies to invest in Libya and support the country's efforts to double its oil production and advance field infrastructure and restoration of life projects. Libya's National Oil Corporation (NOC) outlined an ambitious energy sector agenda, counting increased oil production, local content development and decarbonization as key pillars of progress.

Featuring ministers from Turkey and Malta and representatives from OPEC, OAPEC and APPO, LEES 2024 positioned Libya at the center of regional and global energy interests, underscoring its geostrategic position in the Mediterranean and proximity to European markets. Private sector participation at the summit was resounding - with company addresses from TotalEnergies, Eni, Repsol, BGN, Oilinvest Group and more - and successfully united operators and service providers in a shared quest to produce two million barrels of oil per day, while prioritizing low-carbon solutions.

LEES 2024 marked the beginning of a new era for Libya, shaped by world-class oil, natural gas and renewable resources, diversified investment prospects and cross-sector collaboration. Building on the success of this year's event, we look forward to returning to Tripoli.

### Panel Discussions Target FDI



The Libya Energy & Economic Summit featured two days of informative panel discussions uniting key industry players and targeting a wide range of topics. In the flagship panel sponsored by SLB – A New Libya – Built on Energy – oil and gas operators came to the table to discuss Libya's two million barrel-per-day production target. According to the panelists, the "achievable" target will be met through a strong services sector and modernized infrastructure that can reverse declining production and improve productivity at existing brownfields.

During the session, Renewable Power Supporting Economic Growth, LED by the Renewable Energy Authority of Libya, panelists explored the viability of producing renewable energy in Libya for export to Europe and which policies would support Libya's transformation into a clean energy hub. Featuring high levels of solar irradiation, Libya has placed renewable energy and green hydrogen at the cornerstone of its energy transition plans.

Public and private sector firms united for the Financing Libya's Projects: Investment, Competitiveness and Partnerships panel, in which foreign investment was positioned as the key to unlocking potential across Libya's economy. Panelists stressed the importance of a mature legal and regulatory system for the oil and gas sector that guarantees stability, drives private sector participation, ensures competitive project economics and builds investors confidence.

The panel Trends in North African Energy: Servicing the Future of the Industry addressed the role of service providers in helping Libya to achieve its production goals. The panel identified strategic areas of investment and expansion for Libya's service providers, focusing on natural gas, LNG technology and infrastructure optimization.





### **Industry Briefings**



#### **OAPEC**

The Organization of Arab Petroleum Countries (OAPEC) – of which Libya is a founding member – presented an industry briefing outlining the relevance of member countries on the global energy stage. According to Abdulfattah Dandi, Director of the Economics Department and Supervisor of the Media Department, OAPEC countries hold approximately 55% of global oil reserves and 26% of global gas reserves. Member countries' share of global oil production is set to increase to 36.5% by 2045, in which Libya will play a key role due to its untapped oil potential and close proximity to energy-hungry markets.



#### OPEC

An industry briefing from the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) – in which Libya is also a member – affirmed that Libya's energy growth will be accompanied by its economic recovery. Dr. Mohammad Al Kazimi, Chief Upstream Oil Industry Analyst for OPEC's Energy Studies Department, advocated a forward-looking approach when it comes to the future energy scenario, anticipating a 22% increase in global energy demand between now and 2045, in which oil and gas are projected to make up 55% of the energy mix.

#### **Sonatrach**

Amid global efforts to transition to cleaner energy sources, Algeria's national oil company Sonatrach weighed in on how Libya and North Africa can leverage natural gas – featuring lower emissions than both coal and oil – to meet energy demand. According to Rachid Hachichi, Sonatrach's CEO, gas is projected to be the second-largest energy source by 2040. Achieving net-zero requires innovative solutions that provide for a just and inclusive transition and harness all sources of power to stimulate global energy development.

### Official Closing Statement



Over the course of two days, the Libyan capital, Tripoli, hosted the second edition of the Libya Energy & Economic Summit, with the participation of more than 1,300 participants from more than thirty countries, representing double the participants in the first edition held in 2021.

The participants were representatives of a number of countries and a number of leading companies in the field of oil, gas and renewable energies, representing the countries of Turkey, Italy, Spain, France and Algeria, while the most prominent companies present were BGN, Eni, Repsol, TotalEnergies, Oilinvest and Sonatrach.

The participants enriched their discussions within the two-day dialogue sessions hosted by the summit on many general topics, most notably oil and gas exploration, energy production and development of renewable energies, in the presence of a number of experts and official figures.

After opening the summit, Prime Minister Abdul Hamid Al-Dbeibeh held side meetings with the energy ministers of the countries of Malta and Turkey, in addition to representatives of a number of major energy companies, through which Al-Dbeibeh stressed Libya's interest in developing the energy sector and enhancing cooperation in the field of exploration and drilling.

On the sidelines of the summit, several side meetings took place between Libyan officials and the attending companies to discuss joint cooperation in the fields of exploration and production development.
